Home School Agreement Policy

Mission Statement

- Have a positive relationship between the school and the parents.

The school will:

- Maintain a high standard of education, keeping in line with national curriculum with Islamic ethos.
- Provide a safe, secure and happy environment, where children are well cared for, treated fairly and where teaching is good.
- Encourage children to take care of school property, their surroundings and others around them.
- Encourage and motivate your child to do the very best they can.
- Be open and welcoming and offer opportunities for you to become involved in school life.
- Endeavour to meet the requirements of children whatever their needs to achieve their full potential.
- Promote Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural (SMSC) development in all aspects of the curriculum and extra-curricular activities, teach children to develop a positive attitude towards everyone regardless of difference in gender, race, culture, belief, values, age, and need.





- Help children to understand their role in the community, promoting community cohesion and British values.
- Keep parent's informed about your child's progress, homework, attendance, punctuality and about general school matters.

The parents/carer will:

- Make sure that each child attends school regularly and arrives on time. If the child is absent or late then a phone call should be made stating the reason for absence or lateness, provide evidence i.e doctor appointment letter.
- Make sure children wear the correct uniform every day, with the correct haircut (same grade all over), otherwise he will be sent home.
- Ensure children do not bring mobile phones, iPod or any other gadget to school. Otherwise it will be confiscated, first time it will be confiscated for two school weeks, second time for six school weeks and third time the device will be confiscated for one academic year if the device is not used during school. However, If the device is used during school, it will be confiscated for full academic year every time it is brought. Moreover, latest DfE guidelines will be applied if necessary. "Where a member of staff finds an item which is banned under the school rules they should take into account all relevant circumstances and use their professional judgement to decide whether to return it to its owner, retain it or dispose of it".

- Build a positive partnership with the school for the benefit of their children.
- Avoid taking children on holiday during term time.
- Support their children with homework tasks & other learning opportunities and ensure homework is returned within the set time.
- Support and work with the school in any behaviour management programmes as outlined in the behaviour policy summary (including same day detention policy)
- Support the school's values, rules and policies, by encouraging a positive attitude towards school.
- Work in partnership with the school to develop positive attitudes towards those from different cultures and races and with different feelings, values and beliefs.
- Let the school know immediately of any problems at home or medical concerns that may affect their children's work or behaviour at school or ability to do homework.
- Read and act upon any information sent home.
- Endeavour to provide a safe, secure and happy environment at home.





- Encourage other opportunities for home learning.
- Support the school and proprietor in fundraising and other activities.
- Foster a positive attitude towards education and the school and use discretion when discussing issues or grievances in front of children, as these may have a negative effect on their outlook.
- Inform the school immediately if any of the contact details change.
- Make sure children do not bring any chewing gum in school, they will be fined £50.
- Don't give any money to your child without any confirmation from the school (Text/letter/email). At DHLNW unaouthorised money dealing is not allowed.
- If any student is late without any valid reason (unacceptable reasons are, wake up late, traffic, siblings drop off) and no evidence is provided, he will be given extra work to copy which will start from 3 pages of lines.
- The parents/ guardian will support and follow all school policies. Following the school behavior policy is key to success in teaching and learning within the classroom setting. If your child falls short of the standard required in terms of behavior then we reserve the right to ask the child to leave Darul Hadis Latifiah Northwest and find another school.

The child will:

- Attend everyday on time expecting to work hard.
- Be ready for lessons, on time and with the correct equipment / uniform including correct haircut. (same grade all over), otherwise will be sent home.
- Always do best in all areas of school work, both in lessons and at home.
- Take advantage of all opportunities offered to me by the school, both within and outside lessons.
- Show respect for all members of the school and all property within the school.
- Follow the school's behaviour policy and uniform code.
- Respect other's culture, race, feelings, beliefs and values.
- · Accept responsibility for the things they do.
- Take responsibility for school and homework and to ask for help and to do their best in all they undertake.
- Be kind and speak politely to everyone in school.
- Take good care of the building, equipment and school grounds.
- Behave in a safe way.





- Be helpful and friendly.
- Tell a member of staff if there is any concern.
- Ensure that they will take home all school letters.
- Not to bring any gadgets in school (it will be confiscated)
- Not to carry any unacceptable stuff e.g. e-cig, knife, cigarette, e-cigarette, lighter, Drugs, etc. (it will be confiscated and disposed off)
- Not to bring any Fancy items, fancy pen, pencil, keyrings, or the likes. (it will be confiscated and disposed)
- Not to bring any fizzy/energy drinks, chewing gum, ornaments, metal watches, body spray etc (it will be confiscated and disposed).
- Not to buy or sell anything in school. Not to be involved in any money dealing even if someone is giving/offering as gift.
